

Parking management

Curbspace priorities

- 1. Transit
- 2. Passenger and commercial loading
- 3. Short-term customer parking
- 4. Parking for shared vehicles
- 5. Vehicular capacity

Parking with a placard or plate in Seattle

Allowed

- Valid out of state disabled parking plates and permits
- Free parking at on-street paid parking meters and pay stations (State law)
- Can park at paid and time-limited street parking for longer than posted time
- Can park in Restricted Parking Zones
 (RPZs) without an RPZ permit, for longer
 than posted time

Not Allowed

- Use of loading zones (load/unload and passenger load zones) past time allowed
- Parking in No Parking or No Stopping areas
- Parking in peak period restricted areas (e.g., No Stopping 3 pm – 6 pm)
- Parking in car-sharing and carpool parking zones

State role

- Department of Licensing manages permits
- State law dictates free parking
- Enables 4-hour time limit

- \$250 ticket for using invalid placard
- Disabled parking taskforce






Proposed changes to state law

- Increase fines
- Create progressive fines for repeat offenders
- Strengthen placard replacement standards
- Reinforce physician requirements
